- The Newsletter section and Newsletter Archives for both "In the Loop" and "Quest Bulletin" (specifically gaming events) are live on the BCPL website! Thanks go to Cher and Laura for their work on this.
- We are very close to having digital access to local newspapers (Press and Sun 1985-, Evening Press 1960-1985, Binghamton Press 1927-1960, Binghamton Press and Leader 1905-1927) available on our website for BCPL cardholders both in and outside the library.
- The whole department is benefitting from James' work in Programs and Exhibits. We are now working with a monthly template that James creates to keep our social media posts organized and to make sure that staff do not overlap in promoting programs. James has taken on about half of the posts promoting programs and collections for the department and it has been a relief to have that promotional support when new programs are scheduled or new partnerships are made!

#### **Programming Updates**

- The Seed Library has served 235 patrons and counting since its launch on March 15.
   Michaela has put out over 1,394 vegetable and flower seed packets (so far) through a donation we received from CCE!
- Our Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) tech help program was relaunched in February 2025. Through bi-monthly 1 on 1 appointments, Michaela has recently assisted patrons with setting up email accounts, accessing digital resources through Libby and recording outgoing voicemail messages.
- Three winners received a BCPL swag bag containing a branded coffee mug, pens and stationery for participating in our Library Lovers Month activities in February. Thanks go to Michaela for designing the BCPL branded swag and Cher and Michaela for promoting Library Lover's month with displays, social media posts, and in house activities.
- Our Dungeons and Dragons and Gaming programming, coordinated by Laura, continues
  to engage a returning community of gamers. This program is unique in its detail,
  organization and high quality. We recently received positive feedback from a returning
  member to the program that said, "as someone who is relatively new to this area, I
  cannot express enough how wonderful it is to see the library actively engaging in
  community outreach through such exciting and immersive programs."

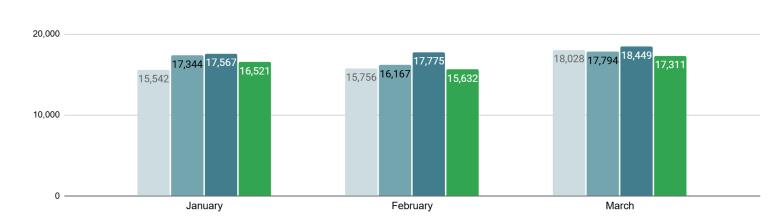

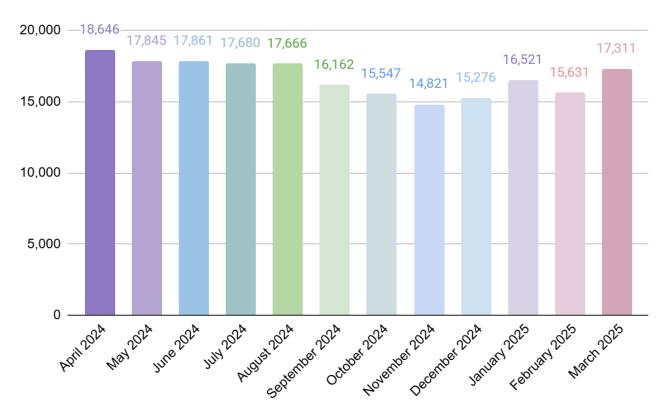
## Circulation:

This graph accurately shows circulation for January, February, and March of 2022-2025. There was an error with the last graph.



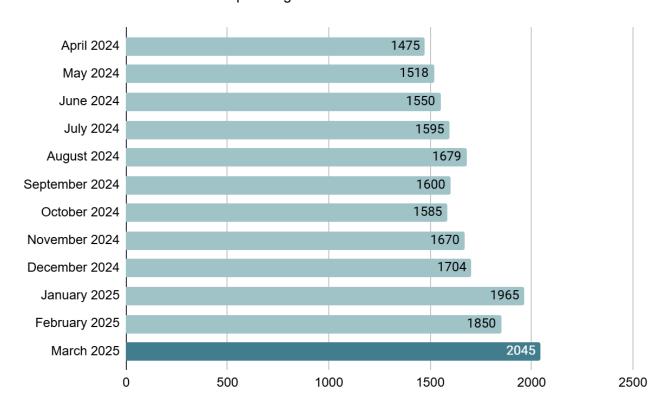


## Circulation stats for the past year:



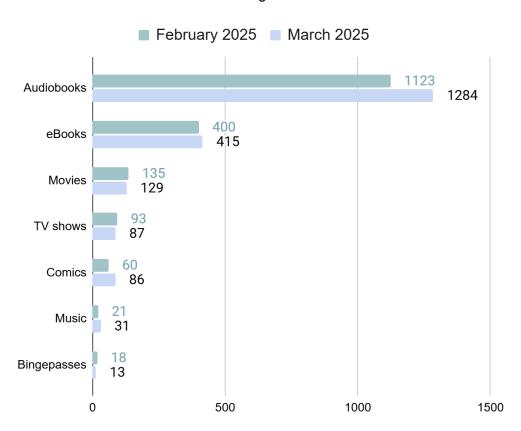
### **Hoopla Circulation:**

Hoopla usage continues to increase.



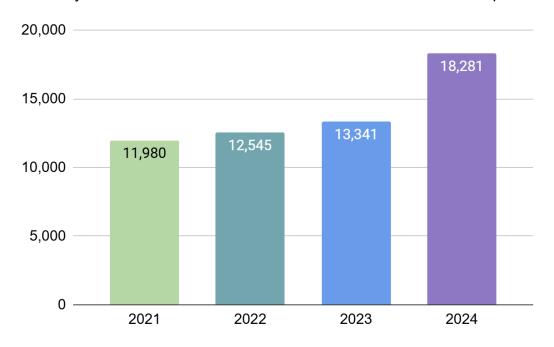
## **Hoopla Circulation by format:**

Audiobook usage increased.

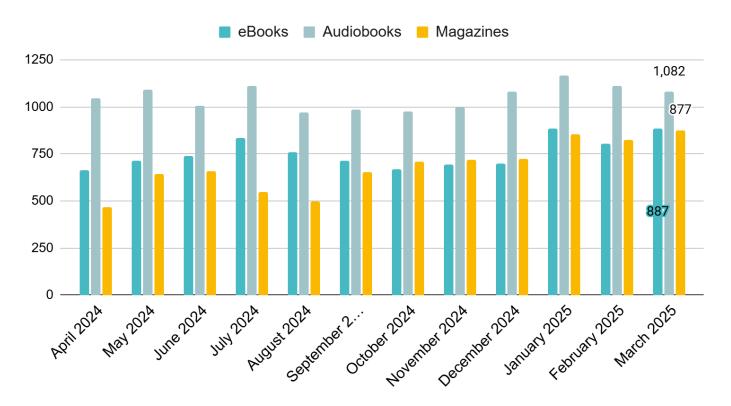


### **Hoopla Circulation Yearly Totals**

Here you can see the annual total number of circulations for Hoopla.

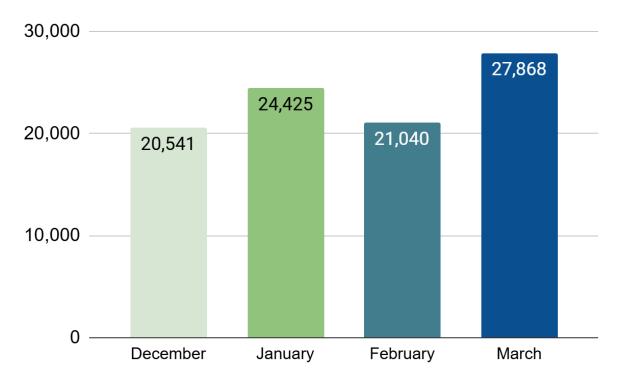


### Libby Circulation for eBooks, Audiobooks, and Magazines over the last year:



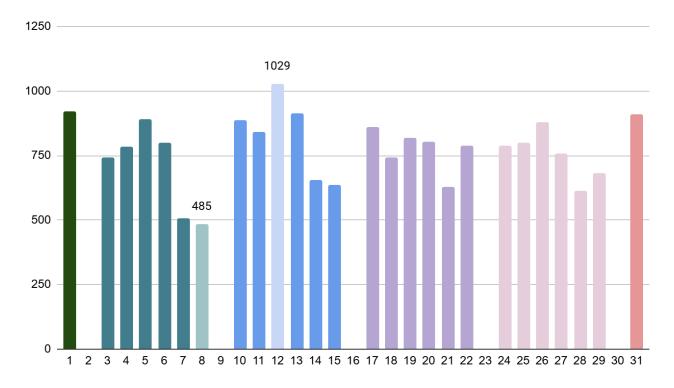

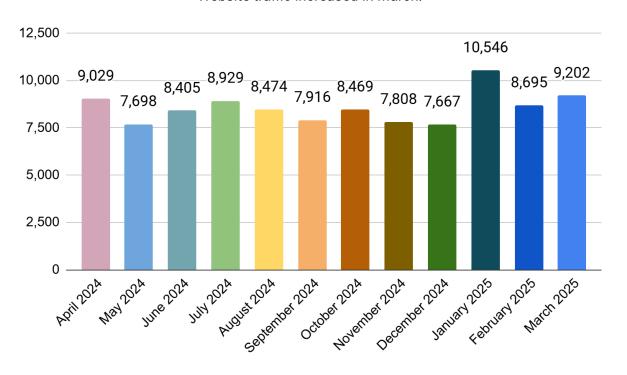

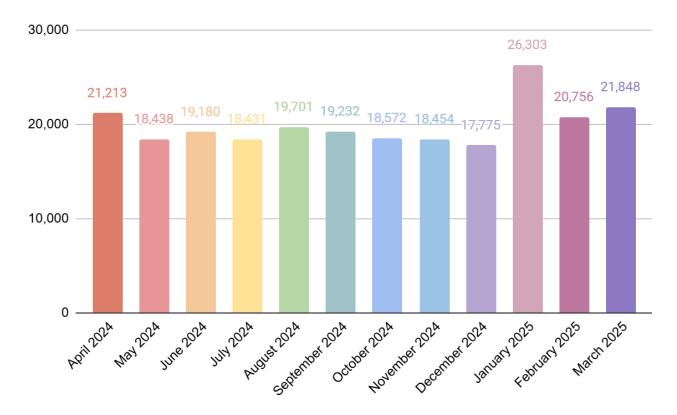

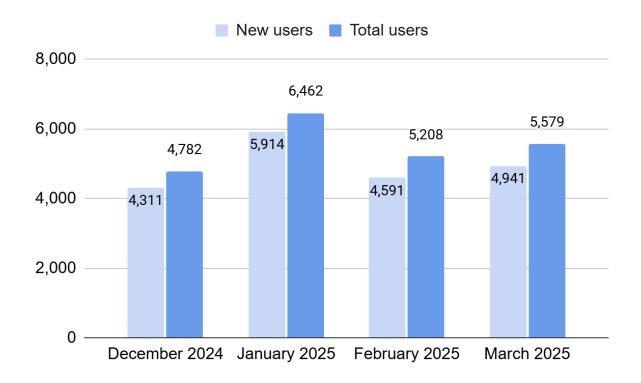


## **Website Pageviews:**

This graph shows total pageviews for the past 12 months.

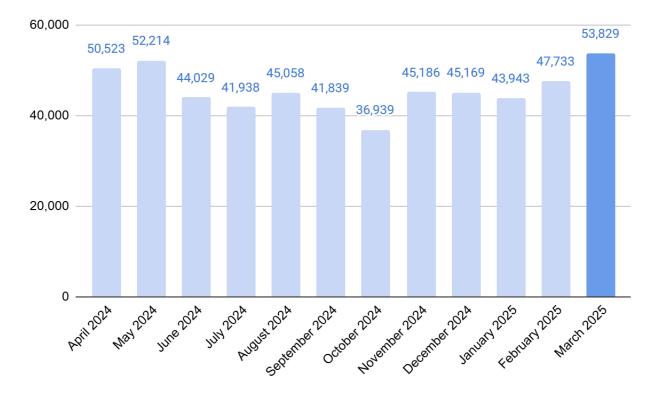

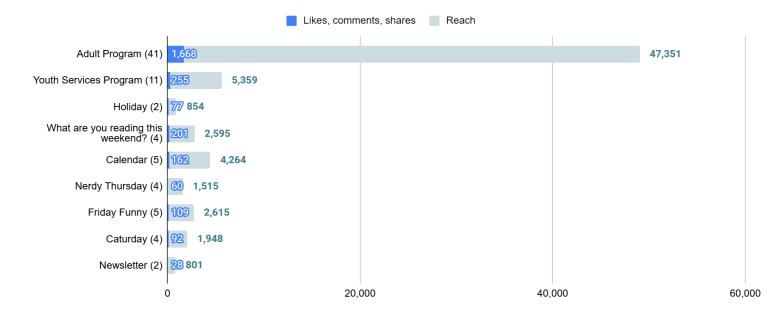

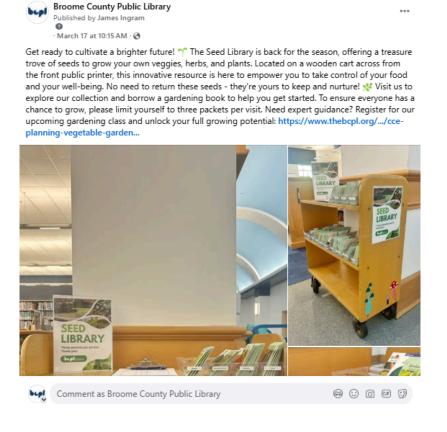
#### Social Media:

This graph shows social media posts for March. The number beside the title is the amount of posts in that category.



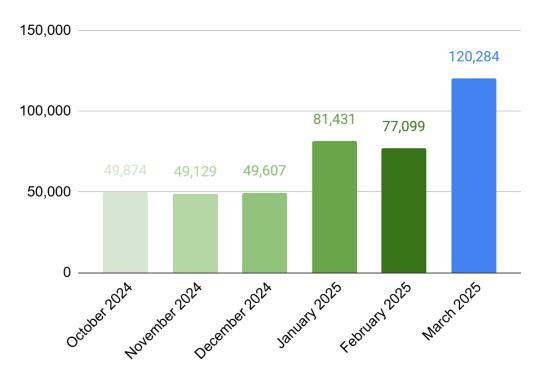

**Broome County Public Library's Post** 



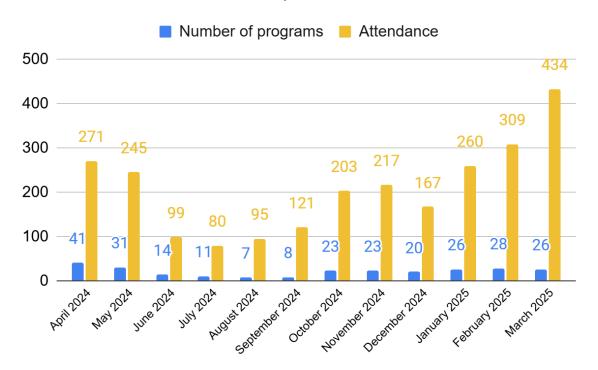
**Facebook pageviews:** 

Facebook pageviews increased 56% from February to March!

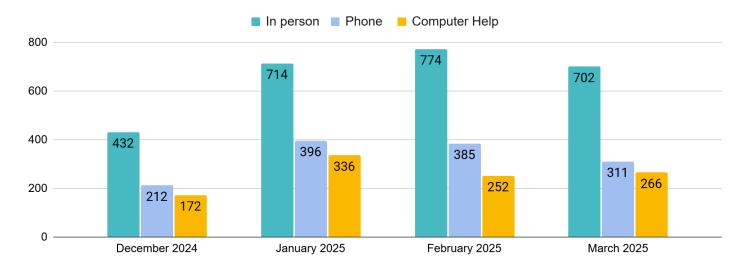


# Adult program attendance:

# **March 2025 Youth Services Board Report**

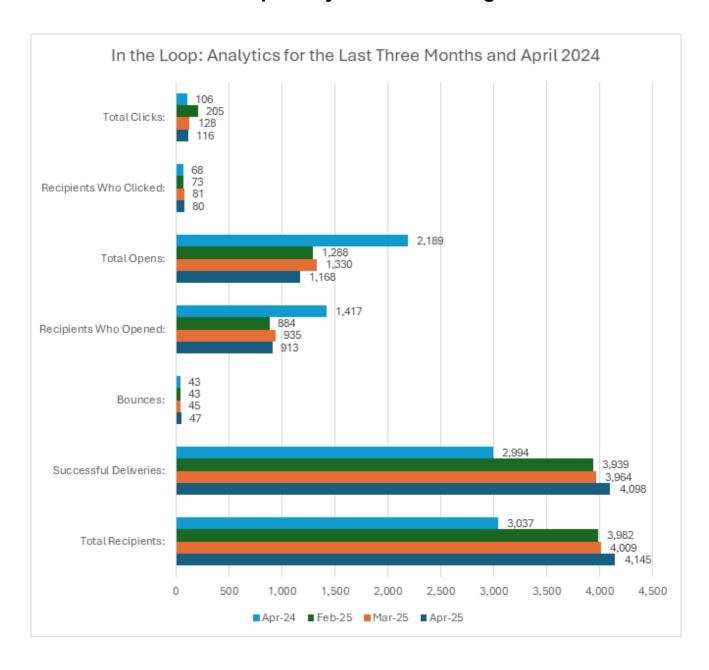

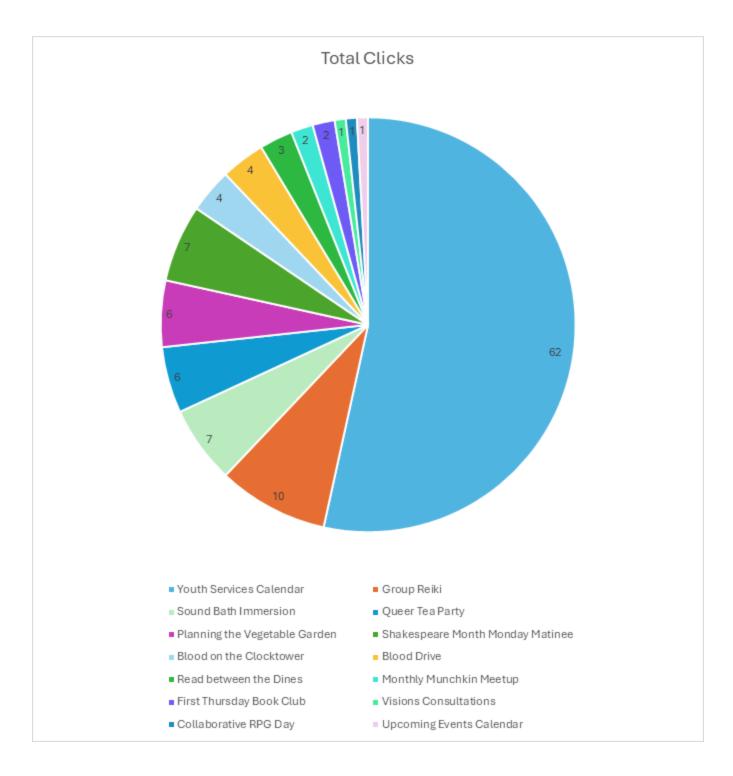
